Dear Advocate of New Horizons,

If you see a heated argument happening between intimate partners you are a bystander, whether you have chosen to be one or not!

As a bystander, you have the potential to discourage, interrupt or prevent the incident occurring right before your very eyes. You can choose to walk away and do nothing. Or you can choose to be an active bystander.



As an active bystander, you will need to assess the situation to determine what kind of help, if any, that may be appropriate. Factors for you to ask yourself are:

- Do I know the people in the argument?
- How can I prevent or intervene in a way that is safe for all involved?

Do what feels comfortable for you! Be safe!

If you are fast at thinking on your feet:

- ask a question of the couple you don't know "Excuse me, where's the closet gas station?"
- make a statement to the couple you do know "Well hello, I have not see the two of you in a long time!"

A question or a statement may be just enough of an interruption from you to redirect the argument, at least for the time being.

If you have a cell phone on you or if you are on your way into a building, you can call 911 and report the incident to law enforcement.

If you choose to be an active bystander or if you have been an active bystander in the past, thank you for supporting our mission!

Artspire Participation

New Horizons participated in the first annual Artspire event in downtown La Crosse in June. Our goal was to raise awareness about abuse with artwork created by survivors and facilitate healing through the creation of art.

Several people joined New Horizons in our effort to end domestic violence in our community by contributing to a large scale work of art. Using the tree as a symbol of life, participants expressed their stories and shared their hopes and visions for a violence-free future. Through images of roots, bark, branches, leaves, fruits, and sky, participants joined together to create a special tree embodying their community commitment against domestic violence.

“Denim Day” and “The Clothesline Project” are two events where survivors and their allies decorate jeans or T-shirts with their stories, messages, and images to bring awareness about and promote healing from domestic abuse and sexual assault. New Horizons hosts the creation of new items yearly to incorporate into our growing collection. These powerful clothing pieces are used in our public displays about awareness to promote the prevention of violence.

Women's Fund

We are very pleased and excited to be partnering with the Women's Fund of Greater La Crosse in helping survivors of domestic and sexual abuse



achieve self-sufficiency. New Horizons was recently awarded a \$3,500 grant for our Survivor's Fund Project. The Survivor's Fund helps domestic and sexual abuse victims with financial assistance to help them meet their goals. Sometimes as little as \$68 can make a big difference in the life of a survivor. For instance, when Mindy came into New Horizons Shelter, she had fled an abusive situation and didn't have any ID or important documents. She was able to access the Survivor's Fund in order to get a duplicate ID as well as copies of her children's birth certificates so that she could access services through Human Services and her children could get enrolled in school and childcare. A year later, she was on her feet and made a gift to the Survivor's Fund for the same amount that she had been granted in order to pay it forward to the next woman in need. We are so thankful to the Women's Fund of Greater La Crosse for supporting this special project! It truly helps restore hope in the lives of those we serve!

Postal Worker Food Drive

Our shelves are stocked! We are grateful for the postal workers, volunteers, and community members who donated food to the Postal Worker Food drive last May. New Horizons Shelter received 7,500 pounds of food! It was an amazing turnout this year. We now have plenty of non-perishable food items to last until Winter.



Besides feeding those staying at New Horizons Shelter, a box of donated food is given to survivors when they move out of the shelter in order to help them get started in their new place.




A Clothesline Project Display at the La Crosse County Human Services Building.

10 Ways You Can Support Our Mission

1. Donate used clothing, furniture, dishes, shoes, books etc to **2nd Chance Resale**. We receive a portion of the monthly proceeds! Don't have time to drop off at the store located in Bridgeview Plaza? Look for the big PINK bins located at businesses in La Crosse and Trempealeau Counties and pop your small items in! For more information call 1-855-430-6070.
2. Shop at 2nd Chance Resale! There are new items every day. They have a selection of clothing, house wares, books, toys, and more!
3. Bring your old iPhone, Samsung Galaxy, HTC, Android or smartphone to one of our Outreach Centers. We collect, submit and receive \$\$\$! OR hold a collection at your business on behalf of us!
4. Get a Kwik Trip Kwik Card. You can choose to donate 3 cents per gallon of gasoline and 10% of in-store purchases to New Horizons and Kwik Trip matches a portion of your donation!
5. Check to see if your company has a gift match program. Some companies will match your gift doubling the impact of your giving!
6. Check to see if your company has a volunteering match program. New Horizons receives \$1,000 a year from Walmart Foundation because of the hours of service one volunteer gives to us each year.

They had fun, raised awareness, and raised money to help support our shelter and advocacy services!
