W.R.A.P. WISCONSIN RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Wisconsin Rental Assistance Program assists eligible renters who have had a significant loss of income due to the COVID-19 pandemic and need help with their rent.



In general, eligible applicants must be an adult Wisconsin resident with a household income at or below 80% of the county median income in the month of or prior to the application date



Eligible costs include:

- Direct financial assistance for owed rent
- Security deposits



UP TO \$3,000

The Rental Assistance
Program can award up
to \$3,000 per individual
in a combination of
rental payments and/or
security deposits

This program is made possible through funding from the Federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The Wisconsin Rental Assistance Program will be provided on a first-come, first served basis, and the program will expire once CARES funding is exhausted.
