

# SURVIVORS' WALK

#### Friday, October 21st 11 am to 1 pm

Survivors' Walk is designed to provide perspective and education about different types of abuse and the barriers victims face in receiving help. Fall Support Group

#### Wednesdays from 6 pm to 7:30 pm Begins September 28th, ends November 16th



This fall, New Horizons Shelter and Outreach Centers will be offering programming to survivors of domestic and sexual violence through an 8-week support group beginning in September. This group is focused on young women ages 17 to 24.

This program will give individuals a supportive and nonjudgmental space to share their experiences and feelings as well as provide them an opportunity to connect with others who have experienced a similar trauma in their own lives. Additionally, structured programming will share techniques to assist them through their healing process. This group will be offered to a limited number of participants, and it is required that all attendees register by September 21st with our Community Outreach Advocate, Ashley, to ensure it is a proper fit for their personal experience.

Children of adult attendees are welcome to attend our coinciding youth group during the same time with limited space available.

## Come support survivors of abuse in our community by working with us! We are hiring now for various positions.

#### **Lead Crisis Advocate**

#### Full time, \$19.95 an hour

This position provides direct service to clients in shelter and is responsible for supervising a team of crisis advocates. The perfect candidate has supervisory experience, is trauma informed, and excels at de-escalating high stress situations.

#### **Outreach Advcoate**

#### Full time, \$15.75 an hour

This position provides direct service to clients in shelter. The perfect candidate is skilled in active listening and trauma informed care, and they are able to de-escalate high stress situations, and remain calm during crises.

#### **Housing Advcoate**

#### Full time, \$18.30 an hour

This position supports survivors by addressing barriers to permanent housing and builds relationships with landlords and community partners to provide resources to clients. The perfect candidate for this position is skilled in active listening and trauma informed care, able to work with a diverse group of people, and experienced in budgeting. A Bachelors degree is required.
